As we go to press, other shows are simmering along nicely in our cooking pots and will be dished out in the course of the season.

Mentoring

One of our key focuses is knowledge-sharing and support for creativity. Keen to give a leg-up to the next generation, the TOF Théâtre takes a benevolent look at the creative work of emerging artists and shares its experience from 36 years of practice. We offer them a welcome in residence at Le MONTY that provides the best possible conditions – from both a technical and human point of view – thanks to a skilled team, process assistance, support for administration, production, distribution, communication, etc. This support is sometimes also accompanied by open rehearsals, previews, public Q&A sessions and more.

This season, Nicolas Laine will be the TOF Théâtre's associate artist.

We will also continue the mentoring process with **Emilie Parmentier**, **Céline Robaszynski** and two young Senegalese artists, in partnership with the **association Djarama**.



Partnerships

The TOF joins forces with various partners to host shows (such as the Vilar or Centre Culturel 38), provide cross-residencies (with Froe Froe or De Machienerie in Flanders), create awareness-raising shows (with Lire et Ecrire) and question the puppet's place in the public arena (with M-collectif, Aires Libres, among others).

During the next 2 years, in association with Djarama in Senegal and the support of Wallonia-Brussels International (WBI), we will organise a full project of mentorship, creativity, and reflection on Senegalese theatre for young audiences.

Puppetry and associated arts in public spaces

We've launched a reflection project on this theme by organizing a colloquium in 2021 in partnership with M-Collectif, Aires Libres, Le Centre de la marionnette de la FWB and THEMAA; as well as a conference-workshop-evening by the fire in 2023 with Pascal Le Brun-Cordier, director of the Master in cultural projects in public spaces at the École des arts de la Sorbonne (Paris 1).

The objective is to encourage creativity, conceive collaborations, discover audacious experiences, cooperate to share resources, experience and artistic information, and to deepen the relationship between artistic creation and public spaces (in-situ creation). Our aim is to offer a space for reflection, on the place of the puppet in the public arena.

Adults only / Duration: 15 minutes

A new form of show/installation/performance for adult audiences, reinvented for each public space that hosts it.

Taking the form of a reconstituted workshop, a cabinet of curiosities, this exhibition depicts intimate scenes where we discover rare objects from the singular life of a puppet and an artist, like so many little erotic secrets shared... at the turn of a lock!

And Why not!... gently shake up our preconceptions about the division of roles between mums and dads? This puppet show is a fun ride that lets us discover the chemistry between a "mumdad" (blending together of a mum and a dad) and their son. It also allows us to experience the infinite tenderness, the turbulent complicity and the clownish confrontation that punctuate their daily lives.

A two-hander for a man/acrobat and a puppet/child, Why not! is a snapshot of an offbeat, sweet and mad moment in life.

Project "Artiviste"

L Numérique, mon amour... J

Duration: 30 minutes

An interactive project for a public space initiated by adult literacy non-profit association Lire et Ecrire in collaboration with the TOF Théâtre.

All the excesses of a hyper-digitalised society played out and recounted by men and women who can't read and write.

It all starts with a strange mayor and a strange machine: the "QQRID" machine. The machine holds out the promise of a bright, shiny tomorrow. On this, the day of the big switch-on, the mayor lauds his great new innovation: all public services accessible in just one click. But when the first not brilliantly literate and not run-of-the-mill member of the public gets involved, the demonstration quickly goes off the rails... and not in a controlled way.
